Provincial Grand Master & Commissioned Office-bearer Installation

A bright sunny day in August seems a long time ago, but it was great honour for the Province of Ross and Cromarty to host the first Provincial Grand Master Installation since the Covid-19 Lockdown halted all Masonic meetings in March 2020.

On Saturday 28th August at the Ben Wyvis Hotel in Strathpeffer, around 60 Brethren assembled to witness the installation of the Provincial Grand Master and his commissioned Office-bearers.



The hotel venue provided a bright well-ventilated spacious venue to accommodate one of the first meetings of the restart of masonic work.

The Grand Master Mason, and his Grand Lodge Deputation, showed no signs of the enforced eighteen month lay-off, and conducted an excellent installation ceremony, conveyed in a very proficient manner.

Not only was the installation an historic event, being the first installation ceremony conducted by the Grand Lodge of Scotland since the Covid 19 Lockdown, but it was a particularly unique occasion, as in 2006, I was installed into the chair as Right Worshipful Master of my mother lodge, Lodge Seaforth 854, by the then Provincial Grand Master of Ross and Cromarty, Bro. Ramsay McGhee, which to me then was a great honour indeed. Little did I know then that fifteen years on, in 2021, the Grand Master Mason, the same Bro. Ramsay McGhee, would be installing me into the chair as the Provincial Grand Master of Ross and Cromarty.

What makes it further remarkable is that we are both members of the same lodge, Lodge Seaforth 854.

Mother St Duthus is continuing to invest in the future of the Lodge by spending close on £1000 on the Masonic Hall this year. A recent structural survey commissioned by the Lodge revealed that the building was in good condition but, it did make several recommendations to sustain its condition for many years to come. During the summer, a specialist firm treated all the roof timbers. Fire extinguishers and fire blankets have been purchased. The Hall Committee have been extremely busy with Bro Laurie MacKay using his skill to repaint the front door with a special oak wood grain effect, Bro James Morrison has been re-wiring and Brothers Alan Waugh and Donald MacIvor have been greatly enhanced during the summer months with two new hand-made hard-wood gavels being presented by Bro Iain Ross from Ardgay. The gavels have pride of place on the Wardens pedestals.

The Zoom meetings were arranged for August and September. October was our first face to face Regular Meeting in eighteen months.

On 10th August, after the business was concluded, we were treated to a very fine Lecture by Brother Peter Foster Senior, a Past Master of Robertson's Lodge No. 134 and District Grand Prior, for the Knights Templars. His theme was - **The Caledonian Canal.**

"How many of us have crossed the bridges over the Caledonian Canal, some even on a daily basis, without giving a thought about how it came to be?

Some structures are so much a part of the landscape and our experience that we tend to take them for granted as if they have been there for ever. And so it is with the canal. We see it and yet we don't see it! It has become such an integral part of the Inverness area. Research into its beginnings has been a fascinating and educational journey.

Let's travel back in time to the early 1800's, after the Battle of Culloden when the new style landowners (supporters of the Crown) were encouraged to replace the population of subsistence crofters with sheep. The Government became alarmed at the loss of manpower through emigration, especially since the Napoleonic wars were in need of recruits for the services.

Criticised by many on grounds of cost, the canal project was defended because of the great change it had achieved not only in the attitude of Highlanders to work but in the skills, they had acquired and the capital they had accumulated which enabled some of them to take up handicrafts and others to buy fishing boats. The opening in 1822 proved the critics wrong".

The Master thanked Peter for his talk, which lasted some 15 minutes and was followed by some crack which lasted a further 10 minutes. Bro Mike Turner mentioned that Thomas Telford was a Master Mason.

Due to the untimely death of Mrs Mary Gunn, wife of the Master, Brother Donald Gunn, the September meeting was cancelled as a mark of respect to a woman who had done so much for the Lodge over a long period of time. Mary carried out a myriad of tasks in the background for the Lodge and its members and she will be sorely missed. Our deepest condolences are extended to Brother Gunn and his family.

The October meeting saw us once again back in the Lodge, the first time since the 16th March 2020 and as the Master proclaimed – "what a feeling". Though the meeting was primarily a Business Meeting, to allow us to catch up, we also had the pleasure to affiliate Brother David Kinloch to Lodge Fingal. What an honour this is for Fingal. A man of his stature, in Freemasonry. The meeting was closed in due and ancient form.

It was with happiness we returned to our Lodge in Kyle in October. However, we have been away and as The Secretary read the minute from March 2020 it became all to obvious things have not been normal. We sat in our usual stations with a few changes. Secretary and Treasurer are now on opposite sides of the Master, social distancing is observed by non-office bearers and the Deacon duties and book, board, lights carried out ostensibly by one Brother (two at one point). Masks were always worn correctly covering the nose and mouth, even when speaking, and gels, sprays, spare masks, white gloves were available for anyone who needed them. The Secretary wrote the names of the brethren into the Attendance Book. Covid rules obeyed, so it does not rule us.

We are now trying to work out the details for our forthcoming Installation and the timing of Affiliations / Initiation. It was also noted at this juncture that 18 months away from our Lodge necessitates a wee book, close to hand and open at the correct page, even for the brethren best at Ritual. One final observation on the Covid recess. the ties on my Apron had shrunk considerably since its last wearing.

During the prolonged recess we have kept in touch by email, and to make sure this channel of communication is efficient we have some measures in place to ensure delivery and response.

- 1. Each email address to be checked by the Secretary once a year (minimum). A simple email that Brethren MUST respond to.
- 2. Email should be checked daily if possible and responded to immediately or as soon as is practicably possible.
- 3. A policy should be in place that should Brethren not have received email for a specified length of time (a month), whereby he contacts the Secretary to check if either his or the Secretary's email is not working.
- 4. Special care should be taken with GMAIL (Google) and HOTMAIL (and Microsoft email) email addresses as they are especially prone to non-delivery due to stringent spam policies. If secretaries are experiencing "bounces" or "rejected" email, then they should ask their email supplier to add an "SPF RECORD" to their email account (it is a TXT record in the DNS for the domain name for those techie people). This special record helps validate who you are and that your email is genuine. You can also ask any "difficult" email address owners to ADD the secretary's email address to their SAFE SENDERS LIST. This helps prevent email going straight to the JUNK or SPAM folders.
- 5. Instruction given to Brethren on what "REPLY TO ALL" is, and when to use it.

While there are alternatives to email which are more immediate or dependable, they are exclusive, and the use of multiple channels leads to chaos when Brethren have to be contacted using a plethora of differing apps. The one exception is a brother who has no smart phone or computer. He can be texted or phoned.

On a different note... At the Secretaries' Zoom Meeting it was noted that some brethren have problems with the Member Database e.g., Removing a deceased Brother, where he is still listed as an active member and seemingly not removed, despite following the procedure of selection > action > save. Often anomalies like this can be caused by using the Browser's BACK BUTTON. This button should NEVER be used when working with data or databases! Use the CANCEL or SAVE buttons instead. You should always move FORWARD, letting the application do its work, and move on to your next task. Also useful ... If you do have to REFRESH a page, the shortcut is the F5 key at the top of the keyboard or simply click or tap the circle arrow on the browser icon. In special instances you may wish to FORCE a REFRESH, which is achieved by using the CTRL key + F5 or CTRL KEY + the refresh button on

the browser. The procedure is: to hold down the CTRL key and while doing so, tap the F5 key once.


Lodge Loch Ewe had recently been presented with a superb picture of Depute Master Robert Burns. This has now been hung in a prominent place in the West.
